APPENDIX B TO THE RULES OF HEATHFIELD AGRICULTURAL SHOW RULES & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY IN HORSE CLASSES

In the event of Show cancellation fees will be refunded less 10% to cover administration costs.

The Heathfield Agricultural Show reserves the right to disqualify or refuse the entry of any animal for any reason they may deem unfit.

- 1. It is the responsibility of exhibitors to insure all property and livestock which is brought on to the Showground and which is his/ her own, or for which he/she is responsible. The Show requires exhibitors to effect Employers Liability insurance where this is required by statute. The Show also requires exhibitors to effect Public Liability insurance and Products Liability insurance. The Show therefore requires that all exhibitors ensure that they have the appropriate insurance cover for showing purposes.
- 2. All entries must be accompanied by the correct remittance.
- 3. Entries are received on condition that the Show accepts no responsibility for any loss, damage or accident etc., which may be sustained to vehicles, horses, persons or any property whatsoever.
- 4. Closing date for entries is 2nd May 2023, late entries up to 19th May will be subject to Late Entry Fee of £10 with no quarantee of being in the programme.
- 5. The Show reserves the right to combine two or more classes forward on Show day if insufficient entries.
- 6. The Show reserves the right to disqualify or refuse the entry of any exhibitor for any reason they may deem fit.
- 7. Forfeiture of Fees. Failure to exhibit any animal entered will entail forfeiture of entry fees and no refund will be made in any circumstances.
- 8. Objections or any matter involving the judging of a class shall be submitted in writing to the Show Secretary within 60 minutes of the judging of the event being completed, accompanied by a deposit of £25.00, non-returnable, if the objection is overruled. Any objection will be considered by the Show Secretary with two members of the relevant Show Committee.
- 9. Rapping in the collecting ring or anywhere on or in the vicinity of the Showground is strictly prohibited.
- 10. Riders must keep to the Official Exercising Grounds and must use the Horse Walks for access to all rings on the Showground.
- 11. Exhibitors must abide by the rules of the governing body of the association under whom they are exhibiting.
- 12. Anybody RIDING a horse/pony on the Showground or LEADING a horse/pony on the Horse Walk, in the Collecting Right or in the Show Rings must be wearing a hat approved by the governing body of the association under whom they are exhibiting if so required by that governing body or association. All competitors in the jumping phase of the Working Hunter classes must wear correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet one of the current Safety Standards as set out by the British Horse Society see link 2022-bhs-approvals-hat-guide-v1.pdf. For BSPS Classes see Rule 43 in BSPS Handbook. Exhibitors must wear a hat if entering the ring, unless the governing body under which the class is being shown stipulates otherwise, when the exhibitor must have signed and returned to the Secretary prior to show day a Heathfield Agricultural Show waiver form.
- 13. Exhibitors Admission Tickets and Vehicle Passes: All non-member exhibitors will be supplied with wristbands on a strict scale according to the number of animals entered, plus a vehicle pass. (Members will have their members' badges). It should be noted that all passes are issued for the use of the exhibitor only and are strictly non transferable. Any person (whether owner, servant, driver or rider) not carrying an admission ticket must pay the appropriate charge at the gate. Additional tickets may be purchased on line (at the advanced price).
- 14. Vehicle Parking: To be allowed access to the designated parking area apart from the public car parks, all vehicles must carry an exhibitor's vehicle pass showing the exhibitor's name and telephone number. No vehicle access will be allowed to any other areas of the Showground unless prior arrangements have been made.
- 15. All changes to ring timings, etc., will be on the website prior to show day and displayed on a white board in the collecting rings. If in doubt, please check with the Show Secretary.
- 16. Safety. The organisers of this Show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the organisers and all the Officials and Stewards. Animals must not be left unattended or left unsupervised when tied up to vehicles on any part of the showground at any time. No wheeled items, prams, pushchairs or mobility aids are allowed in the horse walk, collecting and judging rings, except the approved vehicles in the driving classes or any vehicles approved by the Show.

- 17. The use of mobile phones is not permitted within judging rings.
- 18. VETERINARY: The Heathfield Show Veterinary Officer's decision is final. a) Contagion: Every exhibitor of any animal which to their knowledge is suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, or which has been in contact with any animal suffering as such, shall pay the Show £50 as compensation and for liquidated damages for each and every animal so sent. In addition, in the event of the Show's Vet certifying that any animal sent for exhibition is in his opinion a possible source of danger, such animal shall be removed with due speed by the Participant, from the Showground, or be otherwise managed as per the Vet's direction with a view to averting the spread of contagion. b) It is a condition of entry that in the event of a serious accident to an animal and on the recommendation of the Show Vet that the animal be slaughtered all efforts will be made to contact the animal's owner for consent to slaughter. If the owner cannot be found within a reasonable period of time, a police officer on site will be asked to provide written authority as empowered under the Protection of Animals Act 2006. If emergency veterinary treatment is required at the Show, exhibitors will be responsible for the cost of any medication or drugs used in the treatment of their animals and payment must be made direct to the veterinary officer at the time of treatment. c) Any animal that is receiving veterinary treatment at the time of the Show should not be entered unless the owner has had the animal examined by their own Vet and it is safe for them to enter the Show. However, animals still showing evidence of disease will not be permitted to be shown.
- 19. Vaccination: It is required that all horses and ponies entering the Showground are vaccinated and the exhibitor must be able to produce a vaccination certificate, which undeniably relates to that animal, completed, signed and stamped by a veterinary surgeon, who is not the owner of the animal, stating that it has received 3 primary vaccinations against Equine Influenza, the first two given not less than 21 days and no more than 92 days apart with a follow up injection 150-215 days later. In addition a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding twelve months. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding seven days, including the day of the Show. Spot checks will be carried out on Show day.
- 20. All horses must comply with current legislation. There will be random checks during the Show day and Horse Passports and/or microchips.
- 21. Once a class has started exhibitors will only be permitted to enter the judging ring with the express permission of the judge.
- 22. Qualifying cards that are required to be signed by the judge must be signed in the ring.
- 23. Exhibitors should carefully read the Rules of the Show and by making an entry to the Show the exhibitor is expressly agreeing to comply with the aforementioned Rules.
- 24. HORSE ENTRIES CLOSE: 2nd May 2023. Late entries will be accepted up to 19th MAY 2023 on line only (Late entries will not appear in the Show Programme and there will be an additional £10 administration fee per late entry.)

EXHIBITORS MUST HAVE PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE COVER TO BE ABLE TO EXHIBIT HORSES AT THE HEATHFIELD AGRICULTURAL SHOW.

RIDDEN COBS

Horse Conformation Judge Mrs Lucinda Sims, Hampshire Horse Ride Judge Mrs Laura Hamilton, Gloucestershire

Held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Horses must be registered with the Association and all owners, exhibitors and riders must be Association members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. **Registration numbers must be quoted on entry form.**

Classes 150, 151 & 152 are qualifiers for **THE ROYAL INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW 2023.** The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify, if the first and second are already qualified then the third will go forward.

Horses competing at the RIHS and qualifying shows in Hunter sections of The Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs and Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes.

The highest placed unqualified exhibit in each Open Affiliated Class will qualify to compete in the **BSHA Supreme of Season Final**. The Finals will be held at the BSHA Hunter & National Championship Shows in September 2023. The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosette in each Open class and a Champion rosette for each section (with the exception of **Open** Working Show Horse, Ladies Show Horse & HOYS Hunter classes).

The two highest placed exhibits not already qualified in classes 150-152 will qualify for the **Equifest Ridden Cob Final** to be held at Arena UK, Grantham om the 2nd - 5th August 2023.

1st, 2nd and 3rd placed competitors in classes 150 – 152 will qualify for the **UK Ponies & Horses Ridden Cob Gold Medal Series** (Affiliation No. 24/A18/8323) at the UK Ponies & Horses Spring Classic 2024 to take place at Onley Equestrian Centre. Competitors are not required to become members of UK Ponies & Horses to compete at the Spring Classic. Qualification Cards are not handed out in the ring; however, results can be verified by the Office.

Class 150: Open Maxi Cob

Location: Main Ring

Mare or gelding 4 years old and over, exceeding 155cms; to be judged as Cobs. Judges must pay particular attention to type (e.g. short-legged animals of COB type). Winners of these classes (Maxi) are not eligible for Open Cob Championships

Class 151: Open Lightweight Cob

Location: Main Ring

Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over capable of carrying more than 14 stone, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms

Class 152: Open Heavyweight Cob

Location: Main Ring

Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over; capable of carrying more than 14 stone exceeding 148cms but not exceeding

COB CHAMPIONSHIP: 1st & 2nd from classes 151 & 152: Champion £10, Reserve £5.

THE HEATHFIELD & DISTRICT AGRICULTURAL SHOW PERPETUAL CHALLENGE CUP for the Best Lightweight.

THE HEATHFIELD AGRICULTURAL SHOW SOCIETY BROAD OAK CUP for the Best Heavyweight.

Horse Conformation Judge The Hon Mrs Dawn Gooch, East Sussex

This is a qualifying show for the **ROYAL INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW 2023**. The two highest placed horses in the Lightweight, Middleweight, Heavyweight and Small Hunter Classes will qualify to enter at the RIHS. No horse lower than second will qualify. All regulations applicable to HOYS qualifiers will apply also to RIHS qualifiers. Amateur ridden hunter class the two highest placed smalls, the two highest placed lightweights, the two highest placed middleweights and the two highest placed heavyweights will qualify.

All entries in Classes 154 -157 & 158 must be on Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain 2023 Show Hunter Register. (Registration Numbers to be shown on Entry Forms and owners and riders must be full members of Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain).

Day ticket = £36 (this entitles competitors to compete at a maximum of 2 shows in the year – at £36 per show it covers rider and owner membership together with horse registration for that show.

Classes 154 -158, & 169-173 are Judged under the 2023 Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain Rules.

1st, 2nd and 3rd placed competitors in classes 154 – 157 will qualify for the **UK Ponies & Horses Ridden Hunter Gold Medal Series** (Affiliation No. 24/A18/8323) at the UK Ponies & Horses Spring Classic 2024 to take place at Onley Equestrian Centre. Competitors are not required to become members of UK Ponies & Horses to compete at the Spring Classic. Qualification Cards are not handed out in the ring; however, results can be verified by the Office.

The two highest placed exhibits not already qualified in classes 154-158 will qualify for the **Equifest Ridden Hunter Final** to be held at Arena UK, Grantham on 2nd - 5th August 2023.

Class 154: Amateur Ridden Hunter

Location: Main Ring

Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over.

Class 155: Lightweight Hunter

Location: Main Ring

Mare or gelding, 4years old and over; capable of carrying up to 79.5kgs and not exceeding 89kgs. Rider to have attained their 16th birthday by 1st January 2023.

Class 156: Middleweight Hunter

Location: Main Ring

Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over; capable of carrying 79.5 kgs and not exceeding 89kgs. Rider to have attained their 16th birthday by 1st January 2023.

Class 157: Heavyweight Hunter.

Location: Main Ring

Mare or gelding, 4years old and over; capable of carrying 89kgs and over. Rider to have attained their 16th birthday by 1st January 2023.

RIDDEN HUNTER CHAMPIONSHIP for classes 155 - 157: Champion £10; Reserve £5

Class 158: SMALL HUNTER

Location: Main Ring

Any mare or gelding, 4years or over exceeding 148cm (14.2hh approx.) but not exceeding 158cm (15.2hh approx.). A horse which is registered as a Small Hunter cannot compete in an Open Weight Class. When registering on the current Show Hunter Register a current Joint Measurement Board Height Certificate or verification of measurement obtained via the JMB online database must be forwarded with the application. Judges are not empowered to question the height of a registered Small Hunter.

The two highest placed exhibits not already qualified will qualify for the **Equifest Ridden Small Hunter Final** to be held at Arena UK, Grantham on 2nd - 5th August 2023.

OPEN PRIVATE DRIVING

Horse Judge Mrs Mary Ford, Hampshire

All horses and ponies must be four years old or over. The Judge will have the power to transfer an entry which in his opinion is entered in the wrong height section. Hackney show wagons and commercial vehicles are not acceptable. Exercise vehicles and pneumatic tyres are acceptable. A brief description of the vehicle to be included with the entry form. £20 travelling expenses will be awarded to each exhibitor.

The driver must be aged 8 years or over on the first day of the show at which they are to compete. A driver under the age of 18 must be accompanied in the vehicle by a competent and responsible person aged 18 years or over. When in the vehicle grooms, passenger/s and driver must have their feet firmly on the floor of the vehicle or use a suitable fixed footrest. This regulation applies at all times and in all areas on the showground. All driver/grooms/passengers under the age of 14 years must wear a correctly fitted hard hat that meets the latest safety regulations when in a carriage or in attendance to a turnout.

Class 159: Driving: ponies not exceeding 138cms

Location: Main Ring

Open to singles and pairs; any type of vehicle, for ponies not exceeding 138cms

Class 160: Driving: ponies exceeding 138cms

Location: Main Ring

Open to singles and pairs; any type of vehicle, for ponies exceeding 138cms

A Concours D'Elegance Driving class of competitors from the above classes will be judged and presented by Honorary Judges The Marquess and Marchioness of Abergavenny

OPEN PRIVATE DRIVING CHAMPIONSHIP. Champion £10, Reserve £5.

BDS Rosettes for Champion, Reserve and Young Driver

THE PADGHAM PERPETUAL TROPHY, presented by the late T Godwin Salt Esq for the Champion.

Special Rosette awarded to the BEST PRIVATE DRIVING VEHICLE.

UNAFFILIATED LOCAL WORKING HUNTERS

Horse Judge Mrs Jan Burdon, East Sussex

Within 30 mile radius of the Showground.

Working Hunter Rules:

Correct showing attire to be worn by all riders (beige jodhpurs, tweed jacket, competition shirt and stock/tie)

Body protectors recommended for jumping phase but not compulsory, correct riding boots & hat to standard must be worn. Horses to be shown true to type (eq plaited, hogged or natural state depending on horse type)

Horses can wear boots for the jumping phase but to be removed for the show phase, martingales are ok to wear for both phases.

First refusal 15 penalties, second refusal 20 penalties, third refusal elimination, jump knock down 10 penalties, fall of horse or rider elimination. Horses will NOT be ridden by the Judge. Horses may be stripped for conformation at the discretion of the Judge and time permitting. An individual show may be required at the discretion of the Judge.

Best Turned Out Rosette will be awarded in each class - to be decided by the Judge

Class 161: Local Working Hunter

Location: Ring 2

over 15hh; Fences approximately 85cm (2'9").

Class 162: Local Working Hunter Pony

Location: Ring 2

not exceeding 14hh; Riders not to have attained their 17th birthday before 1st January 2023. Fences approximately 75cm (2'3").

Class 163: Local Working Hunter Pony

Location: Ring 2

exceeding 14hh but not exceeding 15hh; Fences approximately 75cm (2'6")

Class 162 & 163 will be amalgamated if insufficient entries.

WORKING HUNTER CHAMPIONSHIP - Champion £10, Reserve £5

THE HEATHFIELD & DISTRICT AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY DAVIES GILBERT PERPETUAL CHALLENGE CUP for the Best Working Hunter

Qualifier for the **Sunshine Tour Championships**. 1st - 4th place qualify and qualification cannot go down the line. To be held at the All England Showground, Hickstead 14th - 17th September 2023.

UNAFFILIATED RIDING CLUB HORSE

Horse Judge Mrs Debbie Barr, East Sussex

Horse/pony suitable for all Riding Club or Pony Club Activities, will be required to jump.

First refusal 15 penalties, second refusal 20 penalties, third refusal elimination, jump knock down 10 penalties, fall of horse or rider elimination. Horses will NOT be ridden by the Judge. Horses maybe stripped for conformation at the discretion of the Judge and time permitting. An individual show may be required at the discretion of the Judge.

Best Turned Out Rosettes with be awarded in each class - to be decided by the Judge.

Classes 164 and 165 will be amalgamated if insufficient entries.

Class 164: Unaffiliated Riding Club/Pony Club Horse/Pony

Location: Ring 2

horse and rider suitable for all riding/pony club activities required to jump 85cms; (2'9". Riders must be 15 years old or over on the 1st January 2023.

Class 165: Unaffiliated Riding Club/Pony Club Horse/Pony

Location: Ring 2

horse and rider suitable for all riding/pony club activities, required to jump 75cms (2'6". Riders under 15yrs of age on 1st January 2023.

UNAFFILIATED RIDING/PONY CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP - Champion £10, Reserve £5

Qualifier for the **Sunshine Tour Championships.** 1st - 4th place qualify and qualification cannot go down the line. To be held at the All England Showground, Hickstead 14th - 17th September 2023.

UNAFFILIATED THOROUGHBRED & RETIRED RACEHORSE

Horse Conformation Judge Mrs Laura Hamilton, Gloucestershire Horse Ride Judge Mrs Olivia Fforde, London

Class 166: Unaffiliated Retrained Racehorse Challenge

Location: Ring 2

Mare or gelding 4yrs old or over and of any height. Riders must be 15 years old or over on the 1st January 2023. Horses to be ridden in any suitable bridle and should be plaited. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED.

Horses will NOT be ridden by the judge. Horses may be stripped for conformation at the discretion of the judge.

Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The class to be judged **50%** jumping, **20%** style while jumping and performance and **30%** awarded for show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

PHASE 1: Jumping to be judged:

8 rustic jumps (2' 6" to 3' with a maximum spread of 85 cm)

The following points to be deducted at the end of each jumping round:

10 points to be deducted for a knock down.

15 points to be deducted for a refusal.

20 points for second refusal.

Elimination for third refusal or fall

PHASE 2

Class returns without boots and judged for an individual show/conformation. (In some classes, at the judge's discretion, horses might be asked to do a 'show' following their jumping without leaving the ring. This is often the case with a large number in the class)

Each horse to complete an individual show of no longer than 1 ½ minutes. Show to include the following movements: Walk, Trot, canter showing change of leg, extended canter (gallop) halt and stand, walk off on long rein. Total marks out of 30% for show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

UNAFFILIATED RIDING HORSE

Horse Judge Mrs Debbie Barr, East Sussex

To be judged on type, ride, manners and conformation. Horses will NOT be ridden by the Judge. Horses may be stripped for conformation at the discretion of the Judge, an individual show may be required at the discretion of the Judge.

Class 199: Unaffiliated Riding Horse

Location: Ring 2

Open to mare or gelding 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cm.

Best Turned Out Rosette will be awarded by the Judge

Qualifier for the **Sunshine Tour Championships** to be held at The All England Showground, Hickstead on 14th - 17th September 2023.

1st - 4th place qualify and qualification cannot go down the lime.

LONDON INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW PERFORMANCE PONY QUALIFIERS

Horse Judge The Hon Mrs Dawn Gooch, East Sussex

This Show is a qualifier for the London International Horse Show Qualifying Classes. Only one pony in each of the following classes will qualify. Non-members of the BSPS have seven days to complete their registration and membership to keep the qualification. If not, this will pass to the next exhibitor.

Marks: TOTAL 100

Performance, 60 marks

Presentation and suitability of pony for rider, 20 marks

Type, movement and way of going, 20 marks

Method of Judging for Classes 232 - 234 - Exhibitors will go round the ring as a whole group, (no pull in). They will undertake a display (rather than a show) where they would need to show certain movements which will include walk, including walk on a free rein, trot, canter on both reins, a canter circle, canter transitions on the straight, extension in canter on one rein and a halt. Competitors in these classes will not be stripped.

This Show is affiliated to the British Show Pony Society (BSPS) and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in BSPS Classes whether or not members of the BSPS are subject to the Rules of the BSPS including the disciplinary procedures and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the BSPS.

Class 232: BSPS Junior Performance Pony not exceeding 128 cms

Location: Ring 2
